# ROBERT ALGIE WRESTLER

For Wairarapa born and raised Robert Algie, sport was his greatest interest and he is remembered as one of New Zealand's most popular wrestlers. Robert died on Sunday October 8 1989 less than a week after his 33rd birthday and a fifteen month battle with cancer.



Robert's career began in 1975 at the National Senior Wrestling Championships, a competition he continued to compete in for many years. In 1980, Robert won his first senior title, in the 100kg division. In the following years, Robert won a string of North Island and National titles.

Winning these titles established Robert firmly on the wrestling circuit. He achieved some of the highest honours nationally and internationally and was a member of New Zealand teams competing overseas on fifteen different occasions – a record for any New Zealand athlete.

- World Wrestling Champs, Edmonton, Canada.
- Tour of Japan.
- Oceania Champs, Brisbane, Gold Medal.
- 1985 World Championships, Budapest.
- 1985 Commonwealth Champs, Edinburgh - Silver Medal.
- 1986 Oceania Champs, Auckland - Gold Medal.
- 1986 Commonwealth Games, Edinburgh - Silver Medal.
- 1986 Wairarapa Sports Personality of the Year.
- 1987 Commonwealth Champs, Cyprus.
- 1987 World Championships, France - 12th place.

In 1987 Robert's performance in France would have qualified him for the 1988 Seoul Olympics, but this was not to be.

Throughout his sporting career Robert had openly expressed his gratitude for the support of Wairarapa residents, team officials and coaches. It is a testament to his character and fortitude that during his greatest and longest fight he expressed a desire to help the youth of the Wairarapa through sport.

Robert believed that by participating in sport youth would not "get into trouble" and with assistance they too could experience some of the same success he had in life. **The Trust is endeavouring to pursue this dream for Robert Algie.**

# Can you SUPPORT the TRUST?

The Robert Algie Memorial Sports Trust Incorporated became established in 1990, two years after the talented young sportsman died.



In his memory a fundraising campaign was instigated by his family, the Featherston District and Featherston Sports Clubs, particularly the Wrestling and Rugby Clubs. This initial money, along with further donations and continuing fundraising by the Trustees is invested and the interest earned from this investment is paid out in the form of grants to young Wairarapa sports people under the age of 20.

# APPLYING FOR FUNDING

PLEASE READ BEFORE COMPLETING THE FORM OVERLEAF

The Trust has as its goal the promotion and support of sporting activity for people under the age of 20 years in the Wairarapa region. In providing financial assistance it is stressed priority will be given to those young people who have shown potential in their chosen sport, but require assistance to realise that potential.

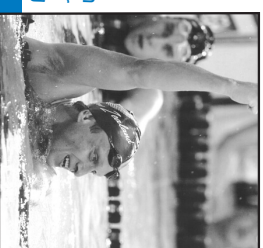
The following conditions will apply for making application to the Trust for financial assistance of any nature.

1. Applications must be made through the applicant's own sports club or organisation.
2. Applications will be received only for individuals and not for teams or groups. Applications from teams do not qualify but applications from individuals within teams do.
3. Applications for assistance are to be made on the Official Application Form (overleaf) of the Robert Algie Memorial Sports Trust Inc.
4. The club concerned will make comment on the application and the ability of the club to give assistance.
5. Grants will be by way of contribution and not for the full cost of the application.
6. In all its deliberations the aim of the Trust is to foster potential in the sporting youth of the Wairarapa.
7. In exceptional circumstances only, the Trust may consider applications from persons 20 years of age or over.
8. The Trust meets in March/June/Sept/Dec but where necessary will consider applications outside these months.
9. The Trust has an expectation of receiving a report from recipients after their sports event.
