



# SCHOOLS GIVE CREDIT TO RUGBY LEAGUE



Wellington Rugby League (WRL) are due their CREDIT having successfully delivered the 'Leadership Through League' programme in schools. The programme has enabled **230** secondary school students to participate in the New Zealand Rugby League (NZRL) Mini Mod Coaching Accreditations programme (in order to gain NCEA credits) from 8 colleges, nearly **3,000** pupils from 37 primary schools received Flag League and approximately **7,314** programme hours were delivered.

WRL development manager, Alex Smits says 'the program shows what young people can achieve with the right support. Once the students got in front of the primary kids it was awe-inspiring. The students have been amazing; they have stepped up another level and taken control and coached with confidence, enthusiasm and a smile on their faces'. The Leadership Through League program has helped to bring about a real sense of community. It gives the older and younger children a chance to interact and is a great way to bring the primary schools and secondary schools together. Secondary school students are taught invaluable coaching skills which are then taught to the primary school children. A vast majority of the college coaches have really embraced the programme and have become very good ambassadors for their college as well as

positive role models within the community, says Alex Smits.

Porirua College had recently completed its turn at the helm of the programme. Glenview, Windley, Holy Family, Porirua East, Maraeroa and Cannons Creek schools all took part in the five-week programme. There were 18 Porirua College students involved, student Nicole Barriball said 'while learning theory in the classroom is important, getting into schools and teaching younger students sports skills and confidence, is just awesome'. Porirua College's director of the sports performance programme Dan Squire says 'the students have enjoyed an innovative way to earn NCEA credits. They're enthusiastic and love going to the other schools and seeing the faces on some of the younger kids'.



The scheme is a real winner. Not only do the senior students gain NCEA credits, they also learn coaching fundamentals whilst helping out in the community. 90% of the college students engaged as coaches are new to rugby league. The program has helped to bring communities together, connecting whanau through sport, from primary school through to tertiary education and beyond said WRL development officer, Matt Everitt.

## Wellington KiwiSport Fund

### KIWISPORT ROUND 5 ALLOCATION - JUNE 2011

The proportion of allocated KiwiSport funding for 2010/11 is 80% non-contestable (\$714,000) and 20% contestable (\$178,000). In total, Sport Wellington is responsible for distributing approximately \$892,000 to support projects that increase the number of school-aged children participating in organised sport.

In round five of the Wellington KiwiSport Regional Partnership Fund, Sport Wellington received 21 applications for contestable and non-contestable funding seeking a total of \$692,945.86. After careful consideration by the KiwiSport Assessment Panel and Sport Wellington Board of Trustees, three contestable and eleven non-contestable applications were approved.

# Round 5 Contestable Fund Applicants

## Wellington KiwiSport Contestable Fund



### Waikanae Primary School

Sports JAM Holiday Programme has secured continued funding for their programme which focuses primarily on the development of fundamental sporting skills of participants which are achieved through participation in sports specific games and activities lead by sports clubs and organisations during the school holiday periods.



### Upper Hutt Rugby Club

Children in years 1 – 6 from every Upper Hutt primary school will be involved in a six week coaching programme incorporating rugby and fundamental ball skills. Professional development will be available for teachers to ensure the necessary skills can continue to be taught and as well as ending with a Rippa Rugby Tournament between all the schools involved.



### Kapiti Boating Club

This project gives every primary aged child in the Kapiti area an affordable opportunity to learn to sail and race. It provides an accessible pathway to explore the fun and life skills that sailing can give. GO-SAIL will be provided to over 500, year six and seven students in eleven primary schools in the Kapiti region, from Paekakariki to Waikanae. Students keen to continue sailing can do so via the LEARN TO SAIL programme.

# KiwiSport Funding Round 6



## KIWISPORT ROUND 6 ALLOCATION - SEPTEMBER 2011

The proportion of allocated KiwiSport funding for 2010/11 is 80% non-contestable (\$714,000) and 20% contestable (\$178,000). In total, Sport Wellington is responsible for distributing approximately \$892,000 to support projects that increase the number of school-aged children participating in organised sport.

In round six of the Wellington KiwiSport Regional Partnership Fund, Sport Wellington received 9 applications for contestable and non-contestable funding seeking a total of \$220,750.00. After careful consideration by the KiwiSport Assessment Panel and Sport Wellington Board of Trustees, **five contestable** and **two non-contestable** applications were **approved in principle**. We will be drawing on a number of mediums to effectively consult with schools, sports, clubs and other stakeholders. The KiwiSport Regional Partnership Fund is school-aged children centred and aims to achieve the following objectives;

- More kids: increase the number of school-aged children participating in organised sport
- More opportunities: increase the availability and accessibility of sport opportunities for all school-aged children.
- Better skills: support children in developing skills that will enable them to participate effectively in sport.

# From KiwiSport To World Cup

## Fundamental Movement Skills Programme

It is a long way from teaching kids KiwiSport to playing in a World Cup but this a step that Ethan Galbraith made has made.

Galbraith is a member of the New Zealand Under-20 team that flew out to play in the Under-20 World Cup in Colombia. New Zealand is in the same group as Cameroon, Portugal and Uruguay and it will take a huge effort to get points against the three heavyweights.

A striker with Lower Hutt Football Club, Galbraith says his personal aim is to get some game time and try to attract the interest of a scout. He does not discount the possibility of New Zealand scoring an upset and says the team has had a good buildup and will go into the games with confidence. He has spent the last few months playing and training with the team, as well as taking KiwiSport into local schools. 'The Wellington KiwiSport Fundamental Movement Programme is a great concept, and I enjoyed being part of it' said Galbraith.

His involvement is with Football in Schools and he says it is amazing how quickly kids develop skills when coached properly. He often sees children with no basic skills really enjoy learning to kick and pass a ball properly. Talking to the kids he tells them if they take it seriously, they can achieve what he has, a message they all take on board.

The Wellington KiwiSport Fundamental Movement Skills Project is a programme to teach school-aged children the fundamentals needed to develop good sporting skills. It is focused on primary schools and has the ultimate goal of getting more young people participating and playing sport. Lead by Hutt City Council with funding provided by KiwiSport through Sport Wellington, the programme includes the delivery of moveMprove (GymSport NZ), a foundation programme that teaches children the basics required to participate in a wide range of sports, Learn to Swim (Swimming NZ and Water Safety NZ) with the aim of teaching as many kids as possible to swim and Football in Schools (Capital Football and Football NZ).
