WHAT IS TŪ MANAWA?

- \$68 million nationally over four years for an activation fund named Tū Manawa Active Aotearoa
- tū - 'to stand' and manawa – 'breath', taken in the context of play, active recreation and sport
- The fund aims to support the provision of, and access to, quality play, active recreation and sport opportunities for tamariki and rangatahi with an emphasis on those who are missing out
- For at least this first year, Sport NZ have identified the priority population groups for this fund as:
 - Māori,
 - girls and young women (including 19 – 24),
 - disabled young people,
 - as well as tamariki, rangatahi and whānau living in high deprivation communities

WHO CAN APPLY? AND FOR WHAT?

- Who can apply?
 - Hapū, Iwi, Marae, Māori organisations
 - Incorporated Societies and Charitable Trusts
 - Regional or Local Council
 - For-profit businesses/commercial organisations and social enterprises
 - Education settings (Primary / Intermediate schools / Kura, Secondary schools / Wharekura, Tertiary Education / Whare Wānanga)
- What can be funded?
 - Project or programme delivery, Equipment, Officials, Delivery staff wages (e.g. activity leader, coordinator)

WHAT'S DIFFERENT FROM KIWISPORT?

- Broadened focus to include play and active recreation, as well as 'organised sport'
 - As a result, Tū Manawa will support a wider range of activity opportunities than KiwiSport and is more clearly pointed at those who are less active or missing out
- Tū Manawa has a strong focus on quality experiences that will encourage participation for life
 - This is a key difference from KiwiSport, which focused on participant numbers and participation opportunities
- Increased investment amount (\$16m per annum nationally vs \$8.5m previously through KiwiSport nationally)
 - Where KiwiSport was a partnership fund that required additional revenue sources, Tū Manawa does not have this requirement

WHAT'S DIFFERENT FROM KIWISPORT?

- Tū Manawa aims for a more even distribution between tamariki and rangatahi, with a stronger focus on innovative ways to activate these groups
- Distinct application and assessment process for Kaupapa Māori applications
 - These applications will be assessed using the Te Whetū Rehua framework, with discussion on these applications being led by our external Māori representative on our Community Decision Making Panel

OPEN FUND

Fund type	Open date	Close date
Open Fund - Round One	24 August 2020	28 September 2020
Open Fund - Round Two	26 October 2020*	30 November 2020*
Open Fund - Round Three	11 January 2020*	15 February 2021*

* Exact open and close dates may be subject to change.

- The Open Funding Rounds are assessed by the Tu Manawa Active Aotearoa Community Decision Making Panel
- There is no maximum amount organisations can apply for. Applicants can expect to be notified of their application outcome within 3 weeks of the Funding Round close date

FAST-FUND

- The 'Fast-Fund' has the same purpose, priority groups, and requirements as the Tū Manawa Open Funding Rounds
 - The difference between the 'Fast-Fund' and the traditional Funding Rounds are how the respective funding streams are administered
- Maximum funding amount of \$10,000 per application
- Fast-Fund applications will be assessed by an internal Sport Wellington assessment panel.
- The Fast-Fund is open year-round; each round will open at the start of each calendar month, and close at the end of each calendar month
- The first Fast-Fund will open 1 September 2020, with the last round opening 1 May 2021

KEY CONSIDERATIONS

- Play / Active Recreation / Sport Funding split
 - Of the total funded projects through this fund, Sport NZ require RSTs to fund at least 20% of in the area of Play, 20% in the area of Active Recreation, and 20% in the area of Sport
- Considerations for 'in school' delivery
 - Completion of the in school / kura setting form for initiatives where delivery will occur in-curriculum time
- Each programme / project to meet a clearly identified need
 - As this is a Community Activation Fund, organisations wanting to run a particular initiative need to have considered the need of the community they are delivering to
